Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Lip Service

Of all the human frailties and foibles, faults and sins, the one that seems to elicit the worst howls is hypocrisy. When we profess to believe and practice one thing, and then are caught behaving in the opposite way, our shame is (or ought to be) profound. Religious hypocrisy is probably the worst. When we hold our actions and beliefs to a higher standard and then fail to live up to them, it's human and sinful and flawed. But when we proclaim that we are holding up that higher standard at the same time that we are knowingly violating it, there is a fundamental dishonesty, a breach of truth that is especially repugnant. It adds sin to sin and dishonors the very idea of virtue. It becomes a scandal.

Sincerity and Truth

Jesus was constantly trying to get people to see and understand that mere observance of the law was not what pleased God. What is in the heart is what is most important. This does not mean that good intentions justify bad actions! We humans are complicated and wily. We are quite capable of creating huge and complex human structures that are just difficult enough to convince us that we are following some right "way" and that others are not. God's laws are simple: love God, love your neighbor as yourself. There is no need to complicate love.

Jesus points out that real uncleanness comes from within a person. Evil intentions and every kind of bad behavior have their roots in our inner sinfulness, our selfishness. That is what Jesus came to save us from. Of course we cannot, by our own devices, be better people. We are utterly dependent on God for the necessary change of heart that will result in good and loving actions. God freely offers us this help, if only we would stop hiding behind the screen of self-righteousness. If we are humble enough to recognize our own selfishness, and loving enough truly to care for the well-being of others, we will be able to fulfill both the letter and the spirit of the law.

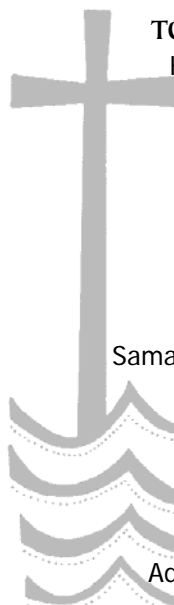

An additional class was added each ensuing year until it became an eight-grade school with one class for each grade.

Today, we have enrolled 265 students for the 2009-10 year in grades kindergarten through eight. This year also brings many new families to our school community and we are happy and blessed to welcome them.

Since 1965, our parish school has been entrusted with the education and formation of over 1,400 students. In fact, today many of our alumni are among us serving as ministers in our church, sending their own children to our school, and participating in civic life in their communities.

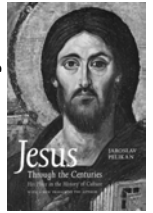
Monday Morning Bible Study

WONDERING WHY

We have so many rules, regulations and laws in life. We have Church laws, federal laws, state laws, local laws, rules at school and the workplace, ethics of business, rules of behavior in our own houses. Most of us as loyal Catholics and good Americans keep most of them most of the time, even when we grumble about some of them. Still, we do our best to be responsible, to do what society expects of us, to do what our families expect of us, to do what God expects of us.

But, what *does* God expect from us? The Bible is full of laws. There are 613 different ones (many repeated more than once) in the Old Testament alone. Do we need to obey them all? Some people think so; others think some of those laws are time-bound and outdated. Most of us do not even know what all of those laws are. For instance, do you refuse to charge or pay interest? Try explaining to Citicorp that you aren't paying any more interest on your Visa card because Leviticus forbids it. Have you eaten a ham sandwich, a shrimp salad, or had cheese on your hamburger lately? If so, you have violated some of the commands in both Deuteronomy and Leviticus. Do you know what to do if your ox falls into a pit on your neighbor's property and dies? If that's slipped your mind, you can find out in Exodus 21:33. When do you need to take a bath? Chapter 15 of Leviticus will provide some guidelines. And the prohibition against cooking a baby goat by boiling it in the milk of its mother is so important that it is forbidden three times, Exodus 23:19, 34:26, and Deuteronomy 14:21. Most of us wouldn't even think of doing such a thing.

As peculiar as some of these laws may seem to us today, they were important to the Israelites as they were establishing a new society. They were considered with justice and equity, hence the laws about interest. They were concerned with health issues, so they had laws about bathing and food. They had laws against idolatry, which is what the one about cooking the goat is concerning, as this was a practice done by the Canaanites as a ritual sacrificial meal in honor of the pagan god Ba'al.

The laws were so important that the Jewish leaders, particularly the Pharisees, created more regulations to protect the laws of Scripture. This was known as "building fences around the Torah." In Jewish writings from the 2nd century B.C. on, rabbis would offer interpretation and create further regulations in order to protect people from accidentally violating some tenet of the sacred writings. Through this process some of the laws became very convoluted and intricate. The goat with milk recipe turned into a prohibition against consuming any kind of dairy product at the same time as a meat product, because, who knows, the milk in that dairy product *may* have come from the mother of the meat source. This evolved further into not allowing dishes which had held milk to touch dishes that had held meat. So, if a dish that once had ice cream in it should touch a dish that had held a hot dog, both dishes would have to be destroyed. This can make housekeeping very complicated, and no longer has much at all to do with idolatry, which was the original intent, and at that time, a valid one.

The intention behind all this was good. The Jewish leaders wanted to keep the people faithful to God's word. But, they created a system so rigorous and scrupulous that the intent of the laws was lost in the intricate detail of keeping all the regulations that had been invented by people to protect it. In fact, as St. Paul would later point out, it was impossible to keep the law.

This is why Jesus is objecting in the Gospel passage. The Pharisees are complaining because the disciples did not wash their hands, perform the purification rituals, before eating. Jesus isn't saying that washing one's hands is a bad idea, he is simply pointing out that they are too concerned with outward gestures and not with the inner cleanliness of the person.

And, while some of the Old Testament laws are still important, such as the 10 Commandments, Jesus summed it all up in one brief statement. When asked what was the most important law, he answered, "Love God, and love your neighbor as yourself. Do this and you have fulfilled the law and the prophets."

Pero cuando proclamamos que nos estamos manteniendo en el plano más elevado, cuando en realidad no lo estamos cumpliendo, hay una deshonestidad fundamental, una violación a la verdad, lo cual es muy repugnante. Agrega pecado al pecado, y deshonor a la sola idea de la virtud. Se convierte en un escándalo.

Sincerid y Verdad

Jesús constantemente trataba que la gente viera y entendiera que el simple cumplimiento de la ley no era lo que complacía a Dios. Lo que está en el corazón es lo más importante. Esto no significa que las buenas intenciones justifican las malas acciones. Los humanos somos complicados y astutos. Somos capaces de crear estructuras humanas, grandes y complejas, que son lo suficientemente difíciles como para convencernos de que estamos siguiendo algún "camino" correcto y los demás no. Las leyes de Dios son simples: ama a Dios, ama a tu prójimo como a ti mismo. No hay necesidad de complicar el amor.

Jesús señala que la verdadera impureza viene de adentro. Las malas intenciones y toda clase de mal comportamiento tienen sus raíces en nuestra maldad interior, en nuestro egoísmo. ¡De eso fue lo que Jesús vino a salvarnos! Por supuesto que no podemos, con nuestros propios medios, ser mejores personas. Dependemos completamente de Dios para el cambio necesario de corazón que resultará en acciones buenas y bondadosas. Dios libremente nos ofrece esta ayuda, solamente si nosotros dejamos de escondernos detrás de la pantalla de que somos personas correctas. Podremos cumplir tanto la letra como el espíritu de la ley si somos lo suficientemente humildes para reconocer nuestro propio egoísmo y amar lo suficiente para velar por el bienestar de los demás.

Services for the Deaf & Hard of Hearing



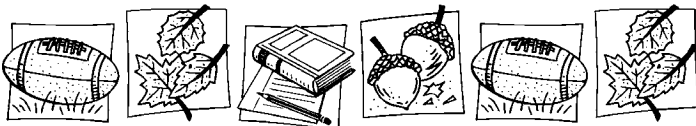
