## THE SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

The 8<sup>th</sup> century Canon of St. Cosmas put the Transfiguration of Jesus into beautiful poetry:

Upon the Mount of Tabor, the promise was made good;  
when, baring all the Godhead, in light itself He stood.

And they, in awe beholding, the apostolic three,  
sang out to God their Savior, for magnified was He."

One of the definitions for 'magnify' in Webster's dictionary is "to enlarge in fact or in appearance." That is what is happening to Jesus on Mount Tabor. He appears larger than life, magnificent in appearance, surrounded by light, a biblical symbol of the divine.

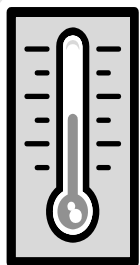
Admittedly, the Transfiguration is difficult to put into a pastoral context that people can understand. None of us has ever been transfigured, that is, appeared in the body we hope to have after the resurrection. But we have put on different faces and persona. We do not always want to project just the image people see of us. We want to "put on our best selves" and maybe reveal something which is not immediately apparent.

Well, we certainly cannot accuse Jesus of putting on a mask. But he did want to give the disciples a bit of a preview of what he would be like when he enters into glory. But, what is glory? It is a share in God's life, a reflection of divinity, the luminous brilliance of God. The Hebrew Scriptures use the word *kabod*, which suggests a person's "inner worth that demands the respect of others." It is "holiness manifest." In God's view, we all have "inner worth", a spark of the divine.

The disciples sometimes missed important revelations of Jesus because they were asleep, as in the Transfiguration. We have to be awake to experience God fully. For most us, the experience of the divine, the revelation of God, does not usually come in dramatic moments like the Transfiguration. Jesus reaffirms that truth; he tells the disciples that they must go down from the mountain, into the world where both pain and love co-exist. There Peter, James, and John will find God. And so will we.

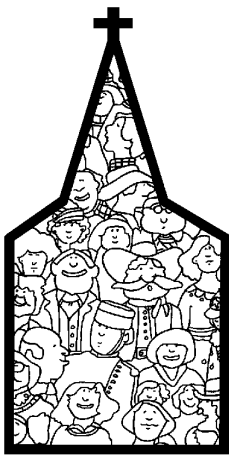

## Respect Life

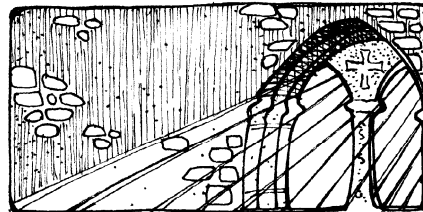

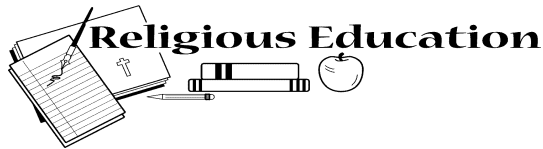

## Does the Bread cease to be Bread and the Wine cease to be Wine?

**Yes.** In order for the whole Christ to be present – body, blood, soul, and divinity – the bread and wine cannot remain, but must give way so that His glorified Body and Blood may be present. Thus in the Eucharist the bread ceases to be bread in substance, and becomes the Body of Christ, while the wine ceases to be wine in substance, and becomes the Blood of Christ. As St. Thomas Aquinas observed, Christ is not quoted as saying, "This bread is my body," but "This is my body".

## EL SEGUNDO DOMINGO DE CUARESMA



El octavo siglote la Canonización de San Cosmas puso la Transfiguración de Jesús en poesía:

Encima del Monte Tabor, la promesa se hizo auténtica;  
Cuando, llevando la humanidad y divinidad, en la luz misma  
Él se mantuvo.

Y ellos, contemplando en admiración, los tres apóstoles,  
Cantaron a Dios su Salvador, porque exaltado es Él."

Una de las definiciones que describe la palabra 'exaltar' en el diccionario de Webster expresa "engrandecer en hechos o en apariencia." Por esto pasó Jesús en el Monte Tabor. Él aparece majestuoso, enaltecido en apariencia, rodeado por luz, un símbolo bíblico de su divinidad.

La verdad es que, la Transfiguración es difícil de poner en un contexto pastoral cual personas puedan entender. Ninguno de nosotros hemos sido nunca trasfigurados, renacer en el cuerpo que deseamos tener después de haber resucitado. Pero sí hemos mostrado diferentes apariencias de nuestra persona. No siempre queremos proyectar nuestra imagen a lo que los demás puedan ver exteriormente. Queremos "poner lo mejor de nosotros" y tal vez revelar algo que no es inmediatamente evidente.

Pues bien, no podemos acusar a Jesús de usar una máscara. Sin embargo Él quiso dar a los discípulos un anticipo de como seria cuando Él entrara a la gloria. Pero, ¿qué es gloria? Es un compartimiento en la vida de Dios, una reflexión de divinidad, el resplandor luminoso de Dios. Las Escrituras Hebreas usan la palabra *kabod*, cual sugiere "la divinidad interna que súplica el respeto de otras personas". Es la 'manifestación de la santidad. En el punto de vista de Dios, todos nosotros tenemos "dignidad interna", una chispa de lo divino.

Los discípulos en veces perdieron revelaciones importantes de Jesús porque aun dormían, en la Transfiguración. Tenemos que estar despiertos para experimentar a Dios completamente. Para muchos de nosotros, la experiencia de lo divino, la revelación de Dios, no usualmente viene en momentos dramáticos como la Transfiguración. Jesús reafirma la verdad; Él dice a los discípulos que tienen que bajar de la montaña, e ir hacia el mundo donde tanto el dolor como el amor coexisten. Ahí Pedro, Santiago, y Juan encontrarán a Dios. De igual forma nosotros también.
