



## THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Some might know how the disciples in the Gospel reading of today felt: fishing all night and catching nothing! But Jesus helps them in spite of their discouragement. They mirror the anxiety and discouragement of the early Church. Jesus calls them "children", so uninitiated, so dependent were they on the mercy of Jesus. When they follow his instructions and put their trust in him, they catch fish and recognize Jesus as Lord.

Jesus pops up in ordinary places. On a walk to Emmaus, in an upper room and now on the beach. He was doing what we do sometimes: cooking on a charcoal fire. This is the secret of God's grace: Jesus appears in the unexpected and ordinary places of our lives. Jesus reached out to the disciples in their need as he does with us, in the normal, natural things of life.

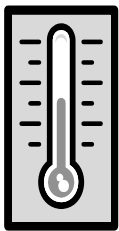
When we understand this, we will know why the early Christians were fascinated by with this fish story and why they chose the fish to be the most ancient symbol of Jesus. Something so ordinary and so plentiful – a symbol of life. God continues to feed us and to help us recognize Jesus. When we put ourselves in touch with the bounty of God's blessings we will recognize Jesus – in food, in bread, in fish, in wine – in all the ordinary things of life.

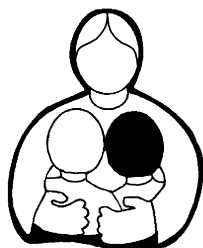
## SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

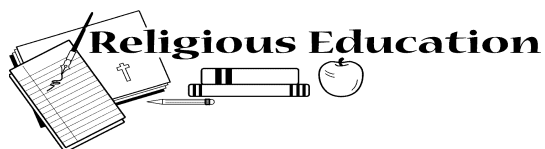

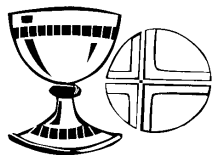

## WONDERING WHY



During the seven weeks of Easter the First Reading at Mass is taken from the New Testament book of Acts of the Apostles instead of the Old Testament Readings which are used on the other 45 Sundays of the liturgical year.

It is during this time of celebration that, instead of looking back on the history and faith that led us to Christ, we look at the history and faith of the early Church as it continues forward from the experience of Jesus' resurrection and ascension. The key verse in this book is Acts 1:8 which remembers Jesus saying to his apostles, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." The remainder of the book goes on to tell how this teaching of Jesus is fulfilled during the lifetime of the earliest apostles.

Acts of the Apostles is written by the same author who composed the Gospel of Luke. We don't know much about him, other than that he was a Gentile, the only non-Jew whose writings are included in the Scriptures. Many of the themes introduced in Luke's account of the life of Jesus continue in his account of the early Church, and the reader will find a number of parallels between Jesus' life and the life of the early Church. For instance, in Luke's Gospel, when Jesus is conceived, the Holy Spirit overshadows his mother, Mary. In Acts, on Pentecost when the Church begins its preaching, this new birth is also initiated by the hovering of the Holy Spirit, this time evidenced in wind and tongues of fire.

Sometimes Acts is referred to as the Gospel of the Holy Spirit because all that happens in the story is initiated by the action of the Spirit. The Holy Spirit is mentioned more often in the Book of Acts than in all the rest of the scriptures combined. Other themes that continue from Luke's Gospel is the ability of the Apostles to continue the healing and forgiving ministry of Jesus, the obligation to care for the poor and marginalized, the importance of Eucharist, the equality of all members of the Church, and the message of the Gospel being given to the Gentiles as well as the Jews.

As Acts 1:8 promises, the apostles of Jesus are witnesses to his teaching and his resurrection first in Jerusalem, then, as persecutions begin throughout Judea, into Samaria, throughout the Mediterranean regions and finally to what this ancient world believed to be the "ends of the earth" – Rome, the center of the Roman Empire. Today, we know that the world extends beyond Rome, to Orange, Nome, Bangkok, Sydney, Johannesburg, Nairobi and many, many more places that these first century Christians could never have imagined – and yet, the promise of Jesus holds true, and WE are his witnesses in this generation – to the ends of the earth!

We have a Rite of Welcome planned for June 3. Anyone who might be interesting in entering the Catechumenate at that time is encouraged to begin the Inquiry part of the process by May 10.

Our Wednesday evening Bible Studies will resume on **April 25** with a Study of the **Book of Revelation**. We will be hearing excerpts from Revelation in our Sunday liturgies during the Easter season, and this opportunity will

assist in understanding this sometimes confusing writing. Come and discover how the Book of Revelation was never intended to frighten people, but rather as a message of profound hope to the early Church and to us. We will meet from 7:30 – 9:00 p.m. in the Ministry Center Library. Please bring a Bible in a modern translation. (New American Bible or New Revised Standard Version are recommended.)

Algunas personas tendrán noción de como los discípulos se sintieron en la lectura del Evangelio de hoy: ¡pescando toda la noche y atrapar nada! Sin embargo Jesús los ayuda a pesar del desanimo de sus discípulos. Ellos reflejan la angustia y el desanimo de la Iglesia temprana. Jesús los llama "niños", muy liquidado, muy dependientes fueron ellos ante la misericordia de Jesús. En el momento que ellos reconocen a Jesús como Señor, siguen mandatos, y ponen su confianza en él, es que pueden atrapar peces.

Jesús aparece en lugares ordinarios. En el camino hacia Emaús, en un cuarto y ahora en una playa. Él hacia lo que nosotros en veces hacemos: cocinar en una fogata con carbón. Este es el secreto de la gracia de Dios: Jesús aparece en los lugares más inesperados y comunes de nuestras vidas. Jesús llegó a los discípulos en su necesidad como lo hace con nosotros, en las cosas naturales, cotidianas de nuestra vida.

Cuando comprendemos esto, entenderemos porqué los primeros Cristianos estaban fascinados por la parábola de los peces y porque escogieron al pez como el símbolo más antiguo para Jesús. Cuando nosotros nos pongamos en contacto con la recompensa de las bendiciones de Dios reconoceremos a Jesús- en la comida, en el pan, en el vino- en todas las cosas cotidianas.

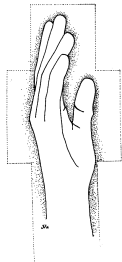
