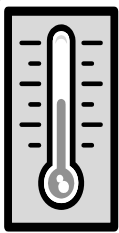

Guadalupeana Scholarships

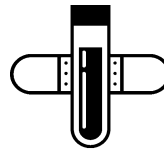

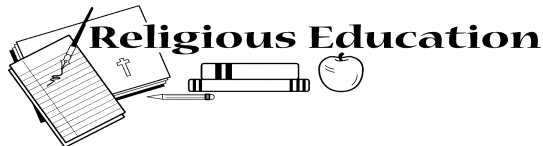

WONDERING WHY

Scripture is filled with images of sheep and shepherds. Most Christians and Jews are familiar with the 23rd Psalm "The Lord is My Shepherd, there is nothing I shall lack." It is a prayer of great comfort, especially to people facing difficult times in their lives. We are reminded that if we follow the righteous paths of the Lord, like a good shepherd he will lead us to places of peace where we can rest and be refreshed. Even when we are afraid, in danger, and walking through dark times he will not desert us, and he will provide us with what we need. The psalm reassures us that God's goodness and mercy are constant, we just need to trust him.

Jesus refers to himself as the Good Shepherd. In the actual events of his life, as far as we know, he never tended any sheep, although he is sometimes pictured in the shepherd's role in artistic representations. Coming from a rural, pastoral culture, Jesus was, of course, familiar with the ways of sheep and shepherds. Although shepherds were looked down upon in this society as unclean and marginalized people, Jesus knew how tenderly a responsible shepherd cared for the animals entrusted to him. The shepherd would lead his flock to places where the sheep could graze on fresh grass, he would bring them to pools of clean, fresh water to drink, he would see to it that they were gathered up and kept safe at night, he would protect them from the attacks of predatory animals, and he would search for any that got lost and wandered off from the flock. Flocks of sheep of different shepherds sometimes mingled in pastures and on hillsides, but sheep can recognize the voice of their shepherd and will follow him when he calls to them.

In a spiritual sense, Jesus could see himself as a shepherd to the people of God. He is the living water that refreshes us, he provides us with our spiritual nourishment in the Eucharist and the Word, he gathers us close to him at dark times, saves us from the attacks of sin and evil, and searches for those who have wandered off and become lost. In today's gospel according to John, Jesus says "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish."

In the Old Testament, God speaks to the Jewish leadership and priests through the prophet Ezekiel. He castigates them for being bad shepherds. God says that they have neglected the sheep while seeking comfort for themselves. They have let the sheep hunger, while becoming fat themselves. They have not searched for the lost ones, nor healed the wounds of those who are injured. In this passage in the 34th chapter of Ezekiel, the text concludes by saying "I myself will pasture my sheep; I myself will give them rest, says the Lord God. The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal, shepherding them rightly."

And God kept this promise. Jesus is the Shepherd, who has come to us in tenderness and compassion, to seek us out, to call our names, heal our wounds, and lead us safely home.

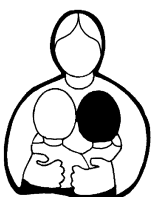

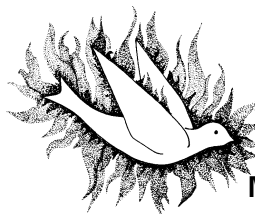
