Dear Parents,

ITBS testing will be finishing up this week. Continue to have your children get plenty of nourishment and rest. Please continue to give non-stressful encouragement.

This Friday is Picture Day. The students are allowed to wear free dress for their pictures. The Free Dress Guidelines as stated in the handbook are:

FREE DRESS REGULATIONS: Free dress is allowed on certain occasions. Students are required to wear neat, simple attire appropriate for school (no **play** clothes, **beach, biking** or **exercise** attire). **School shoes and socks must be worn on Free Dress days.**

BOYS: Cords, cotton pants or jeans, full length or Bermuda length shorts (no cut-offs); knit or cotton shirts with collar. T-shirts are not allowed. Shirts with slogans and designs/pictures that relate to drug, alcohol, or rock groups are not allowed). Hats are not allowed.

GIRLS: Dresses, skirts, cords, cotton slacks, jeans, Bermuda length shorts; cotton or knit shirts with a modest neckline. No T-shirts, crop tops, tank tops, short shorts, leg warmers will be allowed. Hats are not allowed. Jewelry is not allowed on free dress days. Light make-up is permitted on Free Dress days for **EIGHTH grade girls only.**

The school reserves the right to determine the appropriateness of dress as determined by the dress code.

- Each class will nominate a representative from their peers to walk in the fashion show held at 2:00 p.m. in the Old Parish Hall.

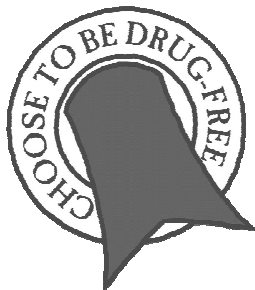
FRIDAY
