In the "DID YOU KNOW" department:

- That the school subscribes to World Book Online and electronic encyclopedia that has a variety of up to the minute information, videos, activities, etc. for all ages. Check it out it is a great resource for everyone.

- That you must have fingerprint clearance as defined by the California State Department of Education codes which requires a more comprehensive screening of school volunteers by the Department of Justice. These codes apply to school volunteers only and not to church volunteers. Unfortunately, if you were fingerprinted under the auspices of the church you will have to be re-fingerprinted to volunteer at the school. As always, safe environment training from the Diocese of Orange is required in order to work at the school or be around children. We have several of you that are safe environment trained but not fingerprinted as well as several of you that are fingerprinted and not safe environment trained. The Diocese is being quite strict on this policy so please be understanding when you are told that you can't work or participate because you have not received clearance. We were informed yesterday the Diocese is experiencing a backlog in regards to fingerprint clearance so please be patient. Please note, that just because you went and were fingerprinted, you are not allowed to work until the school receives your clearance from the Diocese.

Time is running out! The Pension Protection Act of 2006, signed by the President, created a new option for charitable giving, but it is available only until the end of 2007. Please share this information: If you are 70.5 years of age or above, you can donate up to \$100,000 this year directly from your individual retirement account (IRA) to St. Norbert Parish School. The charitable IRA rollover gift is made directly from the IRA custodian to St. Norbert and is a completely tax-free transfer.
